## **CA-NV United Methodist Foundation Hires New Executive Director**

The Foundation Board of Directors is excited to announce that David Malloy is the newly elected Executive Director of the California-Nevada United Methodist Foundation. The California-Nevada United Methodist Foundation serves individuals, local church congregations and conference agencies through professional, socially responsible investment of endowment and

other funds for local churches and church agencies, and legacy giving education and guidance for congregations and individuals.

Malloy comes to the Foundation after serving for 10 years in the Office of Development with the General Board of Global Ministries. In his work with Global Ministries, Malloy worked as the Director of Annual Conference Relationships, communicating the work of the mission agency to the 59 annual conferences of the United Methodist Church.

He cultivated opportunities in designated giving, fundraising for the mission agency's over 900 projects and 350 missionaries in 65 countries. Malloy helped develop partnerships among annual conferences and churches with the mission agency's projects, relief work and missionaries. Malloy also coordinated trainings and presentations to equip church leadership with information on giving opportunities, donation data and project impact. Malloy has worked extensively throughout Africa including Sudan, Uganda, Mozambique and Liberia. He has also worked in Mexico, China and South Korea.


Malloy previously served for four years as the Director of Communications for the Greater New Jersey Conference. In 2006, he served a two-year term as president of the United Methodist Association of Communicators. Before working in New Jersey, David was the fifth recipient of the Judith L. Weidman Fellowship sponsored by United Methodist Communications. The year-long fellowship is intended to prepare young people for careers in religion communication and he worked in the West Ohio Conference communications office.


